Dr. Amer helps patients suffering from TMJ or migraines. “I had a patient with debilitating migraines for years,” she said. “I was able to craft an appliance she wears at night, and her headaches are gone.

And I’ve detoxified many other patients by removing the toxic silver fillings in their mouths.”

When she’s not busy educating patients at her practice, Nevein can be found chauffeuring her three kids to soccer, T-ball and gymnastics and volunteering for non-profits such as the Parkinson’s Project, the women’s shelter and the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.
